TRANSMISSION LINE AND A CESS BOAD EASEMENT

The Grantors, BRUCE M. STEVENSON and MARY H. STEVENSON, and WALLACE E. STEVENSON and TRISCILLA B. STEVENSON, a partnership doing business under the firm names of S.D.S. LUMBER COMPANY and S.D.S. COPPANY, and THE BANK OF CALIFORNIA, M.A., Trustee under the Will of W. F. Daubenspeck, also was william Frank Daubenspeck, deceased (Klickitat County, Hashington, Probate Cause Ho. 1108), former partner, and LEMA E. DAUBENSPECK widow of W. F. Daubenspeck, for and in consideration of the sum of FIFTEEN THOUSAND HIME HUMDRED TER DOLLARS (\$15,910.00), in hand paid by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, receipt of which is heraby acknowledged, hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey to the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns, a perpetual easement and right to enter and erect, maintain, repair, operate and patrol one line of electric power transmission structures and appurtenant signal lines, including the right to erect such poles, transmission structures, wires, cabi lines, including the right to eract such poles, transmission structures, wires, cables, and appurtenances as are necessary thereto, in, over, upon and across the following described percels of land in the Counties of Elickitat and Skamania, in the State of Washington, to-wit:

For legal description, see Exhibit A attached hereto and by

this reference made a part hereof;

together with the present and future right to clear said right-of-way and keep the same clear of brush, timber, structures, and fire hazards, provided that fire hazards shall not be interpreted to include any growing crops other than trees; and also the present right to top, line or fell all growing and dead trees and snags (collectively called "danger trees") located on land owned by the Grantors adjacent to the above-described right-of-way, which could fall within 35 feet of any conductor of the electric transmission facilities hereinbefore described; provided however, it is agreed that compensation is included in the consideration stated above for trees or suage within strips of land colored in green on Exhibits B, C, D, E, F, and G, attached heroto and by this reference made a part hereof; also, individual danger trees described as follows:

One 30-inch in diameter Douglas Fir, 65 feet outside of right-of-way on the northerly side, Opposite survey station 85+90.

One 3h-inch in diameter White Fir, 70 feet outside of right-of-way on the northerly side, Opposite survey station 85+90.

One 18 inch in diameter Bouglas Fir, 5 feet outside of right-of-way on the no therly side, Opposite survey station 1198+60.

One 20-inch in diameter Douglas Fir, 15 feet outside of right-of-way on the northerly side, Opposite survey station 1209+30.

One 2h-inch in diameter Douglas Fir 50 feet outside of right-of-way on the northerly mide, Opposite survey station 6771+00.

One 32-inch in diameter Douglas Fir, 5 feet outside of right-of-way on the northerly side, Opposite survey station 6858+10,

and contiguous to said right-of-way that are danger trees on October 10, 1970 (here-inafter called "present danger trees"). The right to top, limb or full danger trees outside of said strips (hereinafter called "additional danger trees") may only be exercised within 3 years after all present danger trees have been cut, and the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA shall pay the person who is the owner thereof at the date of cutting such additional danger trees the market value prevailing at the date of cutting under authority of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, such payment to be made within a reasonable period of time after they have been so cut; and

Grantors also hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, and its essions, a permanent easement and right-of-way for the construction, operation, use, and maintenance of roads #20 and #50 feet in width on, over, and operation, use, and maintenance of roads #20 and #50 feet in width on, over, and across the land of the Grantora in the Mayor, the SENMS and the SWANE's of Section 11, Township h North, Range 13 Kast, W.M.; the MWSRs of Section 26, the NESSE, the WSRs and the SWANE's of Section 27, all in Township h North, Range 12 East, W.M., and the MANE of Section 12, Township 3 North, Range 10 East, W.M., all in Klickitat County, Mushington.

for the following purposes, namely: the right to enter and to clear of timber, danger trees, and brush, to build, cut, fill, level, grade, drain, surface, use, maintain, repair and rebuild roads and such culverts, bridges, turn-outs, retaining walls or other appurtenant structures as may be necessary, on, over, and across the land embraced within said right-of-way, as shown colored in red on drawings Serial No. 150424 DTM-D, 150404 DTM-D, 150412 DTM-D, and 150414 DTM-D, prepared by the United States Department of the Interior, Bonneville Power Administration, attached hereto as Exhibits B, H, I, J, and K, respectively.

The Grantors reserve the right of ingress and egress over and across said roads and the right to pass an repass along and on said roads insofar as the same extend across the lands of the Grantors, said right to be exercised in a manner that will not interfere with the use of the roads by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, its employees, contractors or assigns.

It is understood and agreed that if said roads are damaged by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, its employees, contractors or assigns, the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, subject to the availability of appropriations, or its assigns, will repair such damage. It is further understood and agreed that the Grantors may erect or maintain fences across such roads, provided adequate gates of not less than 16 feet in width are installed, which may be kept locked, provided the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA is also permitted to install its cwm lock thereon.

It is understood and agreed that the above listed access roads may be used for ingress and egress to and from the Bonneville Power Administration's Hanford-Ostrander No. I transmission line and to and from any existing or future transmission lines which have been or may be constructed adjacent or nearly adjacent thereto.

It is further understood and agreed that the rights acquired by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA herein shall include all necessary and convenient access over, along, and across existing roads on premises owned by the Grantors within existing Bonneville Power Administration easements.

- 1. It is agreed that any damage to Grantors' agricultural crops, fences, or irrigation or drainage systems on the right-of-way resulting from and in the course of construction, reconstruction or maintenance or the transmission line or lines shall be repaired, replaced or paid for by the United States of America or its contractor. Where payment is made, the amount of damages will be determined by an appraisal made by the United States of America.
- The United States of America shall have the right to grade, cultivate, plant and maintain grass, shrubs, or other cover or ornamental plants upon the portion of the right-of-way not otherwise being utilized by the Grantors.
- 3. For the purpose of preserving the natural appearance of the right-of-way, it is agreed by the Grantors and the Government that the right-of-way shall not be used for the accumulation or dumping of litter, trash or other foreign material. The United States of America agrees that any such accumulations resulting from its entry upon the right-of-way for construction or maintenance purposes will be removed or disposed of by the United States of America or its contractor.

As part of the consideration for this grant it is agreed that the foregoing provisions numbered 1, 2, and 3, shall hereafter also apply to the previously existing right-of-way on Grantors' property described in the Schedule of Ramages-Allotted Indian Lands (Vancouver Allotment No. 642), dated January 20, 1954, on file with the Superintendent, Yakima Indian Agency, Toppenish, Wachington (Tract Mc-R-67); in the casement dated August 2, 1954, recorded September 10, 1954, in Book 38, page 381, under Auditor's File No. 47513 (Tract Mc-R-60); the easement dated October 20, 1954, recorded November 5, 1954, in Book 39, page 1, under Auditor's File No. 47809 (Tracts Mc-R-81, 82, 83, 85 and 89); and in the easement dated July 31, 1954, recorded August 11, 1954, in Book 38, page 323, under Auditor's File No. 47405 (Tract Mc-R-84), said easements being recorded in the Deed Records of Skamania County, Wachington.

It is further understood and agreed that the Grantors shall have the right of first refusal to purchase any forest products cut from the above listed Manufest Ostrander No. I transmission line tracts of land; provided Grantors offer terms and prices equal to or better than prevailing market prices therefor. Much Grantors purchase logs hareunder, the volume and grade of same shall be determined in accordance with the Columbia River scaling and Log Grading Bureau.

HAVE AND TO HOLD said easement and rights unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA its lesigns, forever.

Except as bereinabove expressly provided, the Grantors covenant to and with the DELTED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns that the title to all brush, timber or structures existing upon the rights-of-way on October 10, 1970, and the title to all present danger trees shall vest in the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA on said dates and that title to any additional danger trees shall vest in the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA topon their being cut pursuant to the terms hereof; and that the consideration stated herein is accepted by the Grantors as full compensation for all danges incidental to the exercise of said casement and danger tree rights, compt payment for any additional danger trees as defined hereinabove which may be cut under authority of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA as herein provided.

The Grantors also covenent to and with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA that Grantors are lawfully seized and possessed of the lands aforesaid; have a good and lawful right and power to sell and convey same; that same are free and clear of encumbrances, except at above indicated; and that Grantors will forever warrant and defend the title to said easement and the quiet possession thereof against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever.
