

Notice of location must be recorded within thirty days from the date of discovery at the office of the auditor of the county in which such discovery was made. Twenty Acres may be included in one placer claim and if located on surveyed land it must be according to legal subdivisions.

Care must be taken to fully describe the claim with reference to natural objects and permanent monuments or survey description, so that the boundaries can be readily traced. The blank spaces in this form must be carefully and properly filled out.

The discoverer must perform labor upon such location in developing the same to an amount which shall be equivalent in the aggregate to at least \$10.00 worth of such labor for each twenty acres, or fractional part thereof, contained in such location or claim, within sixty days from the date of discovery, and upon performance of such labor, file with the auditor of county an affidavit showing such performance and generally the nature and kind of work so done. Provided however, that certain federal regulations may apply, in addition or in place of the above.




