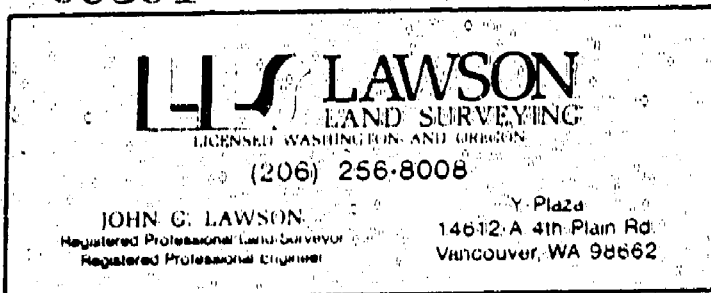

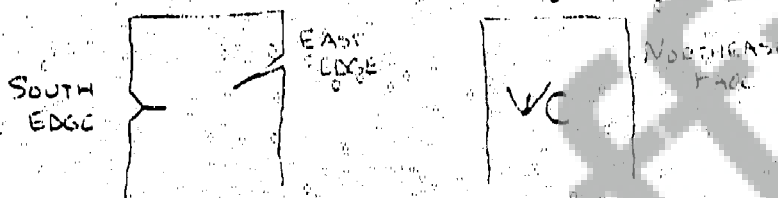
1. History of Corner Establishment and Subsequent Restoration; description of Evidence Found:

This corner was established during a survey by Frederick W. Rase in May, 1916.

We found a basalt sone as described in original notes with a W.C. chiseled on the Northeast face and one notch on the South and East edges, with a mound of stones around it.

We found a basalt bluff 20 feet high, North 36° East, 17.0 feet from the corner, as called in notes, but could not find any original marks.

We found a tumbled pile of 3 large rocks West of the corner.



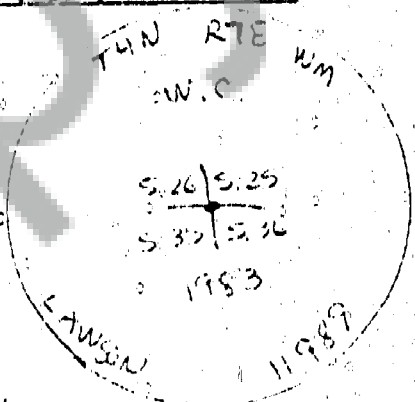
2. Describe Monument, Accessories and Corollary Data to Perpetuate this Corner Location. Diagram corner and indicate meridian and reference to map of record.

LAWSON LAND SURVEYING Job # 34-83-260407; Date of Work: November, 1983

We replaced original found stone with a 2 1/2" aluminum pipe and cap. The stone lies at the South side of the pipe, and we raised a small mound of stones around the pipe we set, and referenced it as follows:

South 1.8 feet to a railroad spike at the base of a 22" diameter Fir, scribed W.C. R.P. with metal tag.

No other trees available.
