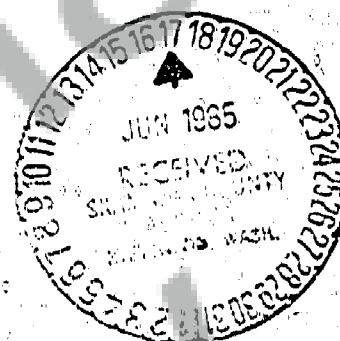

1. History of Corner Establishment and Subsequent Restoration; description of Evidence Found:

This corner was set by Frederick W. Rase during survey in May, 1916. He drove an iron wedge into the center of a Douglas Fir stump 40" in diameter for the corner, raised a mound of stone within the claim, and scribed a Fir 18" in diameter North 69° West, 106 links.

We found a mound of stones and old bent 3" iron bar lying on the ground near it. Old 40" Fir stump was found, but no sign of iron wedge or 18" B.T.



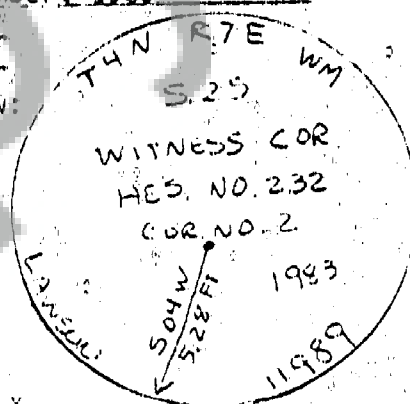
2. Describe Monument, Accessories and Corollary Data to Perpetuate this Corner Location. Diagram corner and indicate meridian and reference to map of record.

LAWSON LAND SURVEYING Job # 34-83-260407; Date of Work: November, 1983

We set a 1" Iron Rod with Lawson #11989 cap at the center of 40" Fir stump for the corner. We then set a 2 1/2" aluminum pipe in the center of the mound of stone for witness corner and referenced it as follow:

North 49° West, 9.9 feet to a railroad spike at the base of a 14" Douglas Fir scribed WC RP with metal tag.

South 24° East, 9.9 feet to a railroad spike at the base of an 8" Douglas Fir, scribed WC RP with metal tag.
