IN SHORT, THE ABOVE ITEMS WERE NOT CLAIMED BY OWNERS WITHIN A ONE YEAR TIME PERIOD SO THEY CAN BE DISPOSED OF. THE COSMETICS WERE DESTROYED DUE TO NO VALUE AND IF I REMEMBER RIGHT THEY WERE WET AND WERE OF NO GOOD USE. THEY TOOLS WE COULD NOT FIND THE RIGHTFUL OWNER AND AFTER WAITING FOR THE REQUIRED TIME LIMIT DID SELL THEM AT AUCTION.

ATTACHED IS THE ORIGINAL OFFENSE REPORT WHICH CLEARLY STATES THE OWNER OF THE TOOLS AS HENSON OR KEMPTON. ACTUALLY KEMPTON HAD GIVEN THE TOOLS TO HENSON. THEY AT THE TIME HAD A ROOFING BUSINESS GOING.

WITH ALL OF THIS IN MIND MY FEELINGS ON THIS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

-MRS. HENDRICKSON HAS NO CLAIM TO THE TOOLS. THEY WERE CLEARLY NOT HERS TO CLAIM IN THE FIRST PLACE.

-THE COSMETICS WERE HERS THEY WERE NOT ADVERTISED DUE TO BEING DAMAGED WITH MOISTURE IN THE EVIDENCE ROOM. THEY HAVE LITTLE VALUE AND I DOUBT IF SHE WOULD HAVE WANTED TO USE THEM ANYWAY AFTER MAXINE KEMPTON HAD HAD THEM IN HER BRA SMUGGLING THEM OUT OF HER HOUSE.

SUMMARY

On July 11, 1971, at 9:45 PM, W/O [redacted] of the [redacted] Sheriff's Office, having been called upon by [redacted] and [redacted] to investigate a theft from the residence of Margaret Hendrickson. Mrs. Hendrickson's drive-way talking to Mrs. [redacted] and [redacted] who believed was a theft being committed in the [redacted] from the residence of Margaret Hendrickson.

This was also witnessed by Margaret Hendrickson and Verna Robbins. [redacted] came out of the residence of Margaret Hendrickson carrying and trying to conceal items later identified as tools. These tools were reported to belong to [redacted] and Mrs. Hendrickson.

In checking the tools which were recovered by Mrs. Hendrickson, she also observed while receiving a chalk line reel from suspect, Maxine's purse, that Maxine had a number of cosmetic items that Mrs. Hendrickson recognized and identified as hers that she reported were taken from her bathroom in the residence.

W/O also witnessed approximately 4 or 5 cosmetic items in Maxine Kempton's purse at the time the chalk line reel was recovered along with one light lavender cosmetic pencil by Mrs. Hendrickson. W/O prevented removal of the other cosmetics until Mrs. Hendrickson looked in her bathroom and verified for sure that a theft had been committed.

Mrs. Hendrickson checked her bathroom and verified that a number of her cosmetics were missing from the bathroom and also in checking the bedroom, claims that two tiny perfume bottles are missing from the bedroom and one tiny perfume bottle missing from her night case that was in the bathroom.

End of summary.

Evidence recovered:

The items above listed as stolen by number were recovered:

Item #1, #3, #3, #4, #5. Item #6, one of which recovered from Maxine Kempton's purse, the other two recovered from the ground adjacent to the passenger side of where W/O's patrol car was parked in Margaret Hendrickson's drive-way.

Item #7, only one lavender pencil was recovered, which this item was recovered at the same time as the tools from the suspect, Maxine Kempton's purse.

Item #8 was recovered from the ground adjacent to where W/O's patrol car was parked at the Hendrickson drive-way, also on the passenger side or north side.

Item #9 was not recovered.

Maxine Kempton was placed under arrest by W/O and transported to the Skamania County S.O. Maxine Kempton was advised of her Miranda Rights by W/O from his Miranda Warnings card in the presence of the matron, Mrs. Mildred Cowles. Maxine Kempton was booked in the Skamania County Jail under Theft III charges. Also a written voluntary statement by Mrs. Margaret Hendrickson and Verna Robbins was obtained regarding this offense. The statements will be included in this report. This will conclude the investigation of this report.

This will be the narrative follow-up on the summary report of this theft.

On 2-13-79 in talking to Mrs. Margaret Hendrickson and Verna Dobbins, Mrs. Hendrickson reports that between 8:00 PM and 8:30 PM, the evening of 2-12-79, Maxine and Verna Dobbins came to the Hendrickson house. Mrs. Hendrickson was on the phone at that time and Maxine said that she had to go to the bathroom.

Mrs. Hendrickson asked Verna to show Maxine where the bathroom was. Verna showed Maxine where the bathroom was, she came out of the bathroom and a short time later, the ladies were talking about injuries, etc. and Maxine had showed Mrs. Hendrickson her operation scar on her chest or stomach.

Mrs. Hendrickson advised she had noticed when Maxine had pulled up her shirt and showed her the scar that she had a light lavender/purple pencil and a small bottle of perfume sticking out of her bra. At that time Mrs. Hendrickson did n't think anything of it being hers.

Mrs. Hendrickson advised she just thought it was a funny place for a woman to be carrying her perfume and make-up stick, but wasn't any of her business and didn't say anything.

Verna Dobbins and Huey Henson, Henson who is now incarcerated in Stevenson Jail on Assault charges, had moved into the Hendrickson garage apartment with no rental agreement, but with a verbal agreement to live temporarily in the apartment and do carpentry work for Mrs. Hendrickson.

Mrs. Hendrickson, Verna Dobbins and Maxine Kempton come down to the Skamania County Sheriff's Dept. this evening, 2-12-79, same date that Mr. Henson was incarcerated, and got the keys to the apartment released from Huey Henson and they went back up to the apartment so that Verna Dobbins could get her clothes out.

While at the apartment, Mrs. Hendrickson notices the bloody clothes of Verna's which Verna was alleged to have been wearing the day Huey Henson had assaulted her. Mrs. Hendrickson was concerned about the clothes along with Verna and Maxine and they called the sheriff's Office to come up and get them because Mrs. Hendrickson didn't want them in the apartment and thought the sheriff's Office still needed them for evidence regarding the Henson assault on Verna.

W/O was dispatched by Sgt. Rogen to the Hendrickson apartment to pick up the clothes. In the meantime, while W/O was responding, Mrs. Hendrickson called attorney Heavey for Verna concerning the bloody clothes and Verna advised that W/O that Mr. Heavey told her not to give the clothes to the sheriff's Office as all they would do is destroy them.

At this time This Officer did not know why the Sheriff's Dept. would need these clothes unless this offense wasn't settled in court and had checked with the Dispatchers regarding Mr. Henson's incarceration and the Dispatcher could not tell this officer whether Mr. Henson had been sentenced on charges or not.

W/O looked at the clothes and decided to call Chief Deputy Blaisdell to find out just what the disposition was with Mr. Hanson and if the Sheriff's Dept. still needed these alleged clothes for evidence. Chief Deputy Blaisdell advised W/O that Mr. Hanson was sentenced for 30 days this date on this offense and would be no need in having the alleged clothes for evidence.

W/O did find out later from Verna Robbins that Mr. Heavey did also tell Verna that Mr. Hanson had been sentenced and it was not necessary for the Sheriff's Office to take the clothes for evidence.

While W/O and Mrs. Hendrickson and Verna Robbins was standing outside on her asphalt driveway talking and at which time W/O was getting ready to leave, Maxine Kempton was in Margaret Hendrickson's house and when she came out she was observed by Mrs. Hendrickson to drop something in the utility room doorway.

Maxine bent down and picked it up and went back inside a little ways and readjusted herself and came back out and walked toward the back of Mrs. Hendrickson's car away from where W/O, Mrs. Hendrickson and Verna were standing. Apparently Verna had also seen what Maxine had picked up and Verna said she's got a hatchet.

Verna said to Maxine "what do you got in your coat?" Maxine said "nothing". Mrs. Hendrickson said "what are you doing, where's that hatchet?" Maxine said "she doesn't have anything".

W/O at this time, asked Maxine to come over to where we were standing. Maxine came over and W/O observed a crescent wrench and a green handled pair of pliers or cutters of some type sticking out of Maxine's coat pocket. W/O asked Maxine what she was doing with the crescent wrench and tools, which were sticking out of her pocket.

Maxine said she was taking the tools home, that they belonged to her husband. W/O had a flashlight shining on Maxine's pockets. Mrs. Hendrickson looked in Maxine's coat pockets and also observed a 16 foot Stanley tape and the green handled tools were a pair of tin snips or cutters. Mrs. Hendrickson took the tape measure out of Maxine's pocket and Maxine grabbed it back.

Mrs. Hendrickson said, "what are you doing, what else do you got?" "That stuff was in that 5-gallon white bucket that was in my house and in my kitchen". Maxine's purse fell open at this time also and W/O and Mrs. Hendrickson observed that chalk line reel was in Maxine's purse and also Mrs. Hendrickson observed number of cosmetics lying on top in the purse and Mrs. Hendrickson stated "those are cosmetics too".

W/O was holding the flashlight shining on the purse and had also seen a number of cosmetics being at least 4 or 5 cosmetic items in the purse. Mrs. Hendrickson at this time reached in and grabbed out the chalk reel and a light lavender colored eyebrow pencil and stated "those cosmetics come out of my bathroom".

W/O at this time, told Mrs. Hendrickson to hold on and to go check in her bathroom to see what cosmetics were there. Mrs. Hendrickson checked her bathroom and discovered a number of cosmetics missing and a sack containing a "hair" and had some other items.

W/O also at this time had Maxine show him what she was holding under her arm which she was holding down with her arm. Maxine had a True Temper sawing knife concealed under her coat. Mrs. Hendrickson said, "OK, what's going on here, you come to my house and rip me off, I'll have you arrested for that".

Maxine at this time denied everything and said, "Take me to jail". W/O having reasonable belief that a theft or attempted theft had been committed in this officer's presence and arrested Maxine Kempton for theft and she voluntarily walked to W/O's patrol car and around on the passenger side of which W/O had to tell her to come back around and get into the back of this officers patrol car on the drivers side, at which time W/O had to fix the back shield up from on the drivers side.

Maxine come back around and got into the back on the drivers side and was transported to the Sheriff's Office. At the time of the arrest, W/O did not take Maxine's purse, and had allowed her to keep it with her and after arriving at the office and the arrival of the matron, Mrs. Mildred Coates, W/O advised Maxine of her Miranda Rights reading it from W/O's Miranda card.

Next Maxine's purse was checked and all but one of approximately 4 or 5 cosmetic items that W/O had seen in the purse earlier was not there. During this time, Mrs. Hendrickson and Verna Dobbins come down to the Sheriff's Office and gave W/O a written voluntary statement and Mrs. Hendrickson gave officer the description of the missing cosmetic items described above.

Next W/O searched the back of W/O's patrol car and couldn't find the items in the back of the car either. Maxine's person was next checked by the matron with negative results. W/O at this time happened to think that when Maxine walked around to the passenger side of this officers patrol vehicle she had time to drop or discard the cosmetic items from her purse.

W/O asked Deputy Fred Ellsworth to go check the area where W/O's patrol car was parked which he did and returned with three other items of cosmetics. One was a blue eye shadow (glass bottle with gold rings), 2) one aqua eye shadow with white top and shorter wider bottom and 3) one eye lash make-up, maroon colored container (Ultra me brand)

The above three items were found on the right side or north side of the location of where W/O's patrol car had been parked. The bottles of perfume that were reported missing in this report were never located nor was the other lavender colored pencil that was reported to be missing. A voluntary consent to search of the suspects vehicle was given to W/O by Maxine and W/O assisted by Maxine's husband, Smokey, (Kempton), did conduct search for the above cosmetic items in her car with negative results.

On 2-13-79 at 1:15 AM, W/O talked to Smokey Kempton, Maxine Kempton's husband, at the Sheriff's Office. W/O asked Smokey if he recognized any of the above five tools. Smokey advised "yes," they all belonged to him. Smokey advised Huey Benson went up and took them off the job at the Mt. Adams Inn approximately 2 to 3 weeks ago. Smokey advised that he told his wife that if Huey Benson wanted the tools that had to let him have them.

W/O asked Smokey what the items were in when Huey took them. Smokey advised that he thought the tools were in a 5-gallon bucket that had been sitting on the roof when Huey took them off the roof of the Inn. Smokey advised that both Huey and Smokey were on the roofing job in Bingen together. Smokey advised that Huey had taken the tools before they had completed the job.

Smokay also advised that he saw Maxine at the chalk line court. During the trial that Verna told him either today or yesterday, being 2-12-79 or 2-11-79, that Verna told him that she didn't get them back for him. Smokay feels that Verna put Maxine up to taking the trial back this evening.

Smokay advised he hadn't seen any of the above cosmetics before and states Maxine very seldom wears any make-up and when she does on occasion wears lipstick and maybe an eyeliner eye make-up.

WFO will also note that Verna Robbins, Maxine's sister, stated that Maxine never wears make-up. Maxine denies ever having seen the three cosmetic items that was recovered from the ground area passenger or north side of the location of where this officers patrol car had been parked at the Hendrickson residence.

the other two cosmetics Maxine claims were hers given to her by Bea Sharpe of Carson. Maxine stated at one point to WFO that why would she have any cosmetics on her, she don't use them anyway. The second statement Maxine made to Smokay Kempton in WFO's presence was that she thought Verna Robbins planted the cosmetics in her purse.

And then in a third statement said to Smokay that the cosmetics in her purse were given to her by this Bea Sharpe in Carson.

WFO did not contact this Bea Sharp in Carson at this time as it was already going on 3:00 AM.

Smokay Kempton advised WFO that he couldn't figure out where Maxine could have gotten all the money to buy all the beer, groceries and bottle of wine that was observed by WFO and Smokay in the back seat of her car. WFO will also note that Maxine was booked into jail having 16 dollars and 97 cents on her.

Smokay advised WFO that Maxine didn't have any money except for a couple of dollars to buy dog food for their puppy.

On 2-13-79 at 12:45 PM, Mrs. Hendrickson called the S.O. and advised that she is also missing a \$5.00 bill off the TV set. The \$5.00 bill was in a birthday card for her son.

On 2-13-79, Verna Robbins contacted the S.O. during the day sometime and advised the day dispatcher that for information that Maxine Kempton stole money out of a purse belonging to a Burl McCoy in Eingen, WA yesterday and this is where she got the money for her beer and groceries.

this concludes this report. This offense has been cleared by arrest.
