Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes

If any person lable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a ten in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such Eablity) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(a) Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors. - The fen imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's tenor, or judgment ten creditor until notice themsof which meets the requirements of subsection (f) has been filed by the Secretary.

(2) Stus Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), properly shall be deemed to be salated (A). Real Property - in the case of real property, at its

 For purposes of paragraph (2) (8), the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a taxpayer whose residence is without the United States shall be deemed to be in the District of Columbia.

(3) Form - The form and content of the notice referred to

in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be vaid not withstanding any other provision of law egarding the form or content of a notice of fen.

(g) Refilling Of Notice. - For purposes of this

(1) General Rule.—Unless notice of fen is retied in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refung period, such notice of sen shall be treated as field on the date on which it is filled (in accordance with subsection (fi) after the expiration of such refling period.

(2) Place For Filing.—A notice of tien refiled during the required refiling period shall be effective only -

(i) such notice of lien is reflied in the office in which the prior notice of fen was filed, and

(i) in the case of real property, the fact of refilling is entered and recorded in an index to the extent required by subsection (f) (4), and

(B) in any case in which, 90 days or more prior to the date of a refling of notice of fen under subparagraph (A), the

Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the taxpayer's residence, if a notice of such lien is also field in accordance with subsection (f) in the State in which such residence is located.

(3) Required Refiling Period.—In the case any notice of fen, the term "required refiling period" means -(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and (B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding required refiling period for such notice of Een.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien. — Subject to such requia-tions as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a conficale of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 50 days after the day on

(1) Uability Satisfied or Unenforceable - The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become legally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted-There is furnished to the Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including any extension of such time), and that is in accordance with such require ments relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon, as may be specified by such regulations.

Sec. 6103. Confidentiality and Disclosure of Returns and Return Information,

(c) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding tien if a notice of fien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(f), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such tien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
