REAL ESTATE CONTRACT

- 1 PARTIES AND DATE: This Contract is entered into on the land of October 1990, by and between WILLIAM C. McLEOD and PATRICIA A. McLEOD, husband and wife, as "Sellers", and BRYAN S. MATHANY and KIMBERLEN S. MATHANY, husband and wife, as "Purchasers".
- 2. <u>SALE AND LEGAL DESCRIPTION</u>: Sellers agree to sell to Purchasers and Purchasers agree to purchase from Sellers, the following described real property in Skamania County, Washington, to-wit:

LOT 3 of the McLEOD SHORT PLAT, in the NE4SE4, Section 20, T3N, R8 E.W.M., according to the official plat thereof on file and of record at page 174 of Book 3 of Plats, records of Skamania County, Washington.

3. PURCHASE PRICE: Purchasers agree to pay a total purchase price of EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED and no/100 DOLLARS (\$18,500.00) of which the sum of SIX THOUSAND and no/100 DOLLARS (\$6,000.00) has been paid by Purchasers, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by Sellers, and the balance of TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED and no/100 DOLLARS (\$12,500.00), is to be paid as follows:

\$2,500.00 on or before the 15th day of January, 1991, and a like sum on the 15th day of each and every 3-month period thereafter, until such time as both principal and interest owing hereunder has been paid in full. The outstanding balance of the purchase price shall at all times bear interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum from the date of this contract and from each such payment so made shall first be deducted interest due to date and the balance thereof shall be applied in reduction of principal.

Payments shall be made to Sellers at their place of residence or at such other place as notified by the Sellers to the Purchasers in writing.

- 4. <u>FULFILIMENT DEED</u>: Upon payment of all amounts due Sellers, Sellers agree to deliver to Purchasers a Statutory Warranty Deed in fulfillment of this Contract. The covenants of warranty in said deed shall not apply to any encumbrances assumed by Purchasers or to defects in title arising subsequent to the date of this Contract, by, through, or under persons other than the Sellers herein.
- 5. POSSESSION: Purchasers are entitled to possession of the property on______.
- 6. TAXES, ASSESSMENTS AND UTILITY LIENS: Purchasers agree to pay by the date due, all taxes and assessments becoming a lien against the property after the date of this Contract. Purchasers may, in good faith, contest any such taxes or assessments so long as no forfeiture or sale of the property is threatened as the result of such contest. Purchasers agree to pay when due any utility charges which may become liens superior to Sellers interest under this Contract.

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- 7. INSURANCE: If applicable, Purchasers agree to keep and maintain insurance on the improvements on said premises in the sum of not less than \$18,500.00, insuring said premises against loss or damage by fire, windstorm, and all other casualties covered by "all risk" endorsements available in the State of Washington. Any such insurance policy shall include the Sellers as a named insured:
- 8. NONPAYMENT OF TAXES, INSURANCE AND UTILITIES CONSTITUTING LIENS: If Purchasers fail to pay taxes or assessments, insurance premiums, or utility charges constituting liens prior to Sellers interest under this Contract, Sellers may pay such items and Purchasers shall forthwith pay Sellers the amount thereof.
- 9. CONDITION OF PROPERTY: Purchasers accept the property in its present condition and acknowledge that Sellers have made no representations or warranties concerning the physical condition of the property for the uses to which it may be put other than as set forth herein. Purchasers agree to maintain the property in such condition as complies with all applicable laws.
- 10. RISK OF LOSS: Purchasers shall bear the risk of loss for destruction or condemnation of the property. Any such loss shall not relieve Purchasers from any of Purchasers' obligations pursuant to this Contract.
- 11. WASTE: Purchasers shall keep the property in good repair and shall not commit or suffer waste or willful damage to or destruction of the property.
- 12. CONDEMNATION: Sellers and Purchasers may each appear as owners of an interest in the property in any action concerning condemnation of any part of the property. Purchasers may within thirty (30) days after condemnation and removal of improvements, negotiate a contract to substantially restore the premises to their condition before the removal. If the condemnation proceeds are sufficient to pay the contract price for restoration or if the Purchasers deposit in escrow any deficiency with instructions to apply the funds on the restoration contract, the property shall be restored. Otherwise, proceeds of the award shall be applied in payment of the balance due on the purchase price, as sellers may direct.
- 13. <u>DEFAULT</u>: If the Purchasers fail to observe or perform any term, covenant or condition of the Contract, Sellers may:
 - (a) Suit for Installments. Sue for any delinquent periodic payment; or
 - (b) Specific Performance. Sue for specific performance of any of Purchasers! obligations pursuant to this Contract; or
 - (c) Forfeit Purchasers' interest. Forfeit this Contract pursuant to Ch. 61.30, RCW, as it is presently enacted and may hereafter be amended. The effect of such forfeiture includes: (i) all right, title and interest in the property of the Purchasers and all persons claiming through the Purchasers shall be terminated; (ii) the Purchasers' rights under this Contract shall be cancelled; (iii) all sums previously paid under this Contract shall

McLeod/Mathany Real Estate Contract - Page 2 of 4 belong to and be retained by the Sellers or other person to whom paid and entitled thereto; (iv) all improvements made shall belong to the Sellers; and (v) Purchasers shall be required to surrender possession of the property and improvements to the Sellers ten (10) days after the forfeiture.

- (d) Acceleration of Balance Due, Give Purchasers written notice demanding payment of said delinquencies and Sellers' reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred for services in preparing and sending such notice and stating that if payment pursuant to said notice is not received within thirty (30) days after the date said notice is either deposited in the mail addressed to the Purchasers or personally delivered to the Purchasers, the entire balance owing, including interest, if any, will become immediately due and payable. Sellers, may thereupon institute suit for payment of such balance, interest, and reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- (e) Judicial Foreclosure. Sue to foreclose this contract as a mortgage, in which event Purchasers may be liable for a deficiency.
- 14. PURCHASERS' REMEDY FOR SELLERS! DEFAULT: If Sellers fail to observe or perform any term, covenant or condition of this Contract, Purchasers may, after thirty (30) days' written notice to Sellers institute suit for damages or specific performance unless the breaches designated in said notice are cured.
- 15. ASSIGNMENT: Purchasers shall not assign their interest in this Contract to any other person without first obtaining written consent of Sellers. Sellers shall not unreasonably withhold their consent.
- 16. NON-WAIVER: Failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of the other partys' obligations hereunder shall not be construed as a waiver of strict performance thereafter of all of the other party's obligations hereunder and shall not prejudice any remedies as provided herein.
- 17. ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS: In the event of any breach of this Contract, the party responsible for the breach agrees to pay reasonable attorney's fees and costs, including costs of service of notices and title searches, incurred by the other party. The prevailing party in any suit instituted arising out of this Contract and in any forfeiture proceedings arising out of this Contract shall be entitled to receive reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred in such suit or proceedings.
- 18. NOTICES: Notices shall be either personally served or shall be sent certified mail, return receipt requested by regular first class mail to respective partys address hereinabove set forth, or to such other addresses as either party may specify in writing to the other party. Notices shall be deemed given when served or mailed.
- 19. TIME FOR PERFORMANCE: Time is of the essence in performance of any obligations pursuant to this Contract.

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- 20. <u>SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS</u>: Subject to any restrictions against assignment, the provisions of this Contract shall be binding on the heirs, successors and assigns of the Sellers and Purchasers.
- 21. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Contract constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, written or oral. This Contract may be amended only in writing executed by Sellers and Purchasers.
