Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes.

If any person liable to pay any tax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a lien in favor of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to such person.

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the liability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason of lapse of time.

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

Purchaser's, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors.—The lien imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any purchaser, holder of a security interest, mechanic's lienor, or judgment lien creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (b) has been filed by the Secretary.

Place For Filing Notice; Form.

- Place For Filing.**—The notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be filed:
 - Under State laws.
 - Real Property.**—In the case of real property, in one office within the State or the county, or other governmental subdivision, as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated and
 - Personal Property.**—In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in one office within the State or the county, or other governmental subdivision, as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated, or
 - With Clerk of District Court in the case of the property of the United States District Court, or the local government in which the property subject to the lien is situated, wherever the State has not by law designated an office, from which the requirements of subsection (a) are
 - With Recorder Of Deeds Or The District Clerk in the office of the Recorder of Deeds or the District Clerk, in the case of property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(2) **State Of Property Subject To Lien.**—For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated—

- Real Property.**—In the case of real property, at its physical location, or
 - Personal Property.**—In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxpayer at the time the notice of lien is filed.
- For purposes of paragraph (2), the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a taxpayer whose residence is within the United States shall be deemed to be in the District of Columbia.
- (3) **Form.**—The form and content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary. Such notice shall be valid notwithstanding any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of lien.

Note: See section 6323(b) for protection for certain interests even though notice of lien imposed by section 6321 is filed with respect to:

- Securities
- Mortgages
- Personal property, purchased at a sale
- Personal property, purchased in good faith
- Personal property, subject to a security interest
- Real property, tax and special assessment liens
- Residential property subject to a mechanic's lien for certain repairs and improvements
- Armed forces
- Certain substance abusers
- Passbook loans

Refiling Of Notice.—For purposes of this section—

General Rule.—Whenever notice of lien is filed in the manner prescribed in paragraph 2, during the required refiling period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed in accordance with subsection (b), after the expiration of the refiling period.

Place For Filing.—A notice of lien referred to in the required refiling period shall be filed in the office in which the notice of lien was filed, and

- In the case of real property, in the office in which the property subject to the lien is situated, or
- In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, in the office in which the property subject to the lien is situated, or
- In the case of property of the United States District Court, or the local government in which the property subject to the lien is situated, wherever the State has not by law designated an office, from which the requirements of subsection (a) are

Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the taxpayer's residence, if a notice of such lien is also filed in accordance with subsection (b) in the State in which such residence is located.

Required Refiling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term "required refiling period" means—

- The one-year period ending 30 days after the expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and
- The one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years after the close of the preceding required refiling period for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

Release Of Lien.—Subject to such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any lien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on which—

- Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable.—The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has become legally unenforceable, or
- Bond Accepted.—There is furnished to the Secretary, and accepted by him, a bond or other security for the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law, including any extension of such time, and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon, as may be specified by such regulations.

Sec. 6103. Confidentiality and Disclosure of Returns and Return Information.

Disclosure of Certain Returns and Return Information For Tax Administration Purposes.—

- Disclosure of amount of outstanding lien if a notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6321, the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes satisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
