Notice is hereby given that the undersigned Citizens of the United States claim fifty hundred feet linear measure on the lode or vein of gold or silver bearing quartz, commencing at this notice and monument and running westerly therefrom along the line of the lode 1500 feet to a stake marked West end center stake and East along the line of said lode a distance of 1500 feet to a stake marked East end center stake, with the dips, spurs and angles of said lode, together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the stake last named and running South therefrom at a right angle with the general direction of said lode three hundred feet to a stake marked S. E. corner stake; thence at right angle West seven hundred and fifty feet to a stake marked South side center stake; thence West 750 feet to a stake marked S. W. corner stake; thence at right angle North 300 feet to a stake marked West end center stake; thence North 300 feet to a stake marked N. W. corner stake; thence at right angle East 750 feet to a stake marked North side center stake; thence East 750 feet to a stake marked N. E. corner stake.
