Notice is hereby given, that I will within ten days, file in the Auditor's office of this county a copy of the hereinbelow described water right.

Notice is hereby given that I claim the water now lying and being in a stream called Collins Creek to the extent of one cubic foot of water to one second of time, for the purpose of floating wood lumber and timber, the same to be taken at a point about 200 feet yards up the creek from the North line of the South East quarter of Section 25, in Township 3 North, of Range 8 East of the Willamette Meridian in Skamania County, State of Washington and running thence in a southerly direction until it reaches a lake called the Jack Long Lake and being in the same section, town and range. Thence running in a southerly direction until it strikes the Columbia River at or about where a wharf now stands known as the Collins wharf.
