

Location of Underwood No 1 Mine

Notice is hereby given, That the undersigned
a citizen of the United States over the age of
Twenty one years, on the 27th day of August
1895, discovered a vein or lode of Lead or
sand rock, in place bearing Gold, silver and
Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located
and have this 27th day of August under and in
accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United
States located fifteen hundred linear feet of this ore
or lode in length, with surface ground three
hundred feet in width on each side of the cen-
ter of said lode, with all dips, spurs and angles also
all timber growing on said claim and all water
and water privileges thereon or appertaining thereto
situated in the Negro Head mining district, County
of Skamania and State of Washington, and known as
the "Underwood No 1" mining claim, and extending fif-
teen hundred feet to and from notice at the discovery of
prosperity shaft, the exterior boundaries of this claim being
distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or per-
manent monuments and more particularly described as
follows, to-wit: Beginning at the north end of
Mason Lacks Lucky Claim corner, thence in a
North by direction 1500 feet to a stake and extending
300 feet each side of the middle of said claim and
