

Notice of Location

Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned, Citizens of the United States, Claim fifteen hundred feet linear Measure on this lode or vein of Gold or Silver bearing quartz, Commencing at this notice and monument and running Westerly therefrom along the line of the ^{said} lode 20 feet to a stake marked West end center stake; and Easterly along the line of said lode a distance of 1450 feet to a stake marked East end center stake, with the dips, spurs and angles of said lode, together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows, to wit: Commencing at the stake last named and running north therefrom at right angle with the general direction of said lode 300 feet to a stake marked South Corner stake; thence at right angle seven hundred & fifty feet to a stake marked South side center stake; thence 750 feet to a stake marked South Corner stake; thence at right angle 300 feet to a stake marked West end center stake; thence 300 feet to a stake marked North Corner stake; thence at right angle 750 feet to a stake marked North side center stake; thence 750 feet to a stake marked North Corner stake; thence at right angle 300 feet to the place of beginning.
