Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned Citizens of the united States,
claim fifteen hundred feet linear measure on this lode or vein of gold or silver bearing
quartz, commencing at this notice and
monument and running Easterly therefrom
along the line of the lode 750 feet to a Stake
marked East end Center Stake and Easterly
along the line of said lode a distance of 750
feet to a Stake marked East end Center Stake,
with the dips, spurs and angles of said lode,
together with the surface ground on each side
