Know all men by these presents that we the Rowe Lumbering and Manufacturing Company, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and forty Dollars, to us in hand paid by John Thompson, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, and sold and do by these presents bargain, sell, assign, transfer and convey to said John Thompson the following described personal property, to wit:

Our undivided one-half interest in and of that certain flume running from that certain lake situated in Skamania County, Washington, called the Jack Long Lake and being in the vicinity of Collins Landing in said County, to the Columbia River, said flume being about one and one half miles in length and being the only flume running from said lake towards the Columbia River and being the only flume in which said company is interested in that vicinity.

Also all our water rights and privileges of every kind and nature in any way connected with said lake or flume and all water right and privileges owned by us in that vicinity.

To have and to hold the above named and described property unto the said John Thompson, his heirs and assigns forever.
