This Indenture, made and entered into this 28<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1899, at Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington, between R. N. and James Shepard, parties of the first part, and Russell Smith & Company, parties of the second part. Whereas:

That the said parties of the first part, have let, and by these presents doth grant, demise and let unto the said parties of the second part, sufficient land on the east side of "Kanaka Creek" on the south half of the Henry Shepard donation land claim, in Skamania County, Washington, for a logging road, said road to be as constructed as not to cover over fifty feet in width, where it crosses the bottom of said land, at the yearly rental of thirty-five (\$35.00) Dollars in advance.

This lease to commence and be in force from the date hereof, and to continue in force and validity so long as the said parties of the second part continue to pay said rent as heretofore specified.
