

State of Washington to E. C. Johnson.

No. 58 Permit to Prospect Mineral Lands.

This provisional Lease, Licence or Permit, made and entered into this 15th day of Jan'y, 1900, by and between the State of Washington and E. C. Johnson of Portland, Ore.,

Witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) paid, the Treasurer of the State of Washington, said State of Washington doth licence the said E. C. Johnson to prospect that tract or parcel of Land now belonging to the said State of Washington and said to contain mineral other than coal (but not known to be mineral bearing at the time of survey), situate in the county of Okanogan, and more particularly described as follows, viz:

Beginning at a quarter post between Secs. 14 and 15, Twp. 3 N., Rg. 5 E. N.W. 1/4, and running thence northeast 70° 1039 ft; thence south 52 1/2 ft to Southwest corner of Bald Eagle claim (wa. used 22°). Thence west of north 20° 1500 ft; thence north of east 20° 600 ft; thence east of south 20° 1500 ft; thence south of west 20° 600 ft to place of beginning, being known as the Bald Eagle claim.

Pub. Bldgs. at S. Cap. Sec 17"

in Section _____, Township _____, Range _____ N.W. 1/4, containing 20.28 acres, the same being in Bald Mt. Mining District.
