

ASSIGNMENT.

THOMAS CONNELL TO CASPER GRUPPER.

Know all men by these presents that we, C. C. Wilson and Annie Wilson, of Skamania County, and State of Washington for and in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 to us in hand paid and for other valuable considerations to us from C.B. Williams of Portland, Oregon, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, for and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, assigns, transfer and set over to C. B. Williams of Portland, Oregon, all my right, title and interest in and to that certain saw mill property situated upon the S. W. Corner of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, Tp. 3, North Range 7 E. W. M. the said mill being the property of Wilson, Grupper Co.

Together with all our right, title and interest in and to all the machinery and other personal property of every kind and description situated and being in said mill, appertaining to or used in connection therewith; together with all the rights of way, flumes, dams, and rights for the construction of the same. Rights of way given by G. W. Iman, T.C. Iman, L. F. Iman, F. G. Iman and J. W. Babbington for the construction of the flumes. All our right, title and interest in and so the contracts and rights given to C. C. Wilson and Annie Wilson under the contracts made with F.G. Iman for the construction of a dam on Rock Creek and of a flume between said dam and the Columbia-----

River said contract being of date April 19, 1899, including all our rights thereunder.

Also all the logs and ties owned by Wilson, Grupper Co. or by me personally situated, situated at or near the said mill. Also all rights in rimber upon the land of Hans Alvick, Lewis Alvick and Casper Grupper also all other claims and rights connected with said mill, all our interest in and to the lease given by Casper Gropper to C. Wilson, M. A. Reed & P. J. Bannon to the present mill site, also all outstanding contracts for the delivery of ties, timber or other building material including all contracts of every kind and nature connected with said mill. It is understood this does not include any debts, demands or account due the firm of Wilson, Gropper Co. It being understood that the material manufactured since November 1st shall be the property of C. Williams upon the payment of the cost of producing the same.

To have and to hold to the said C.B.Williams his executors, administrators and assigns for ever.
