

Know all men by these presents that I Tennis Wyers the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollars. Gold coin of the United States of America, to me in hand paid by Job Angell & G. L. Cline the parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said parties of the second part their executors, administrators and assigns all of the following described personal property, to wit:

The undivided one half interest in the "Number Four" mining claim situated in the Mt. Adams Mining District in Skamania County, Washington and described in the Notice of Location as follows: Beginning at this fir tree on the East bank of the West fork of Lewis River running thence, Westerly 1500 ft. to stake a blazed fir tree 4 ft. South West; thence, Northerly 600 ft. to stake blazed fir tree with top off 6 ft south; thence, Easterly 1500 ft. to stake, on East bank of said stream; thence, Southerly 600 ft. down stream to starting point. Bounded on the South by Tennis Wyers claim.

And I do, for my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns covenant and agree to and with the said parties of the second part their executors, administrators and assigns, to warrant and-----
