The undivided one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in a Fish Wheel known as Paquet & Farrell Fish Wheel situated about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile out of Castle Rock on the Columbia River in Skamania County, together with all appliances appertaining to said wheel, including Boats, sail, oars, rowlocks, shovels, wheel barrows, hatchets, ship anchors, wrenches, and necessary tools to operate said wheel.
