

GEORGE NIX TO JOS. T. PETERS.

Stevenson, Wash. April 11. 1904.

To whom it may concern:

This is to certify that I have this day sold and delivered to Joseph T. Peters, all my right, title and interest in and to a certain lot of fir wood being seventy-five cords in all for the full sum of Seventy five dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, said wood being new cut and lying on my land near Nelson Creek in Skamania County, State of Washington, being not far from the Town of Stevenson.

In consideration of the above I agree to pay to George Nix, when the above wood shall be hauled by him to the Columbia River or otherwise delivered to one of our scows during the summer of the present year the difference between the price named above and whatever the market price shall be for fir wood, when the said wood is received by scowman referred to sometime during the summer of 1904, and soon after the time of high water in the Columbia River.
