

William James & wife + Columbia River Packers Assn.

Know all Men by these Presents, That William James and Cora E. James, his wife, of Multnomah County, Oregon, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty-five Hundred Dollars (\$5500.00) to them in hand paid by the Columbia River Packers Association, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Oregon, of which in said State, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, sell, convey, assign, transfer and set over unto the said Columbia River Packers Association, a certain indenture of lease, bearing date the 18th day of October, A. D. 1904, made by S. B. Joes, of Steamer Cascades, Skamania County, Washington, to the said William James, of a certain strip of gravel bar or shore lands on the land commonly known as Joes Island, between the Columbia River and Slough, 800 feet in width, beginning at the Northeast corner of the Project tract on the Section line between Sections 30 and 31, Township 2 N., Range 7 E. W. M., running thence in a North-easterly direction up the Columbia River to the point or end of the gravel bar, the same being certain shore lands purchased from the State of Washington by said S. B. Joes, all in Section 30, Township 2 North, Range 7 East, W. M., in Skamania County, Washington, said indenture of lease being recorded in the office of the Auditor of said Skamania County in Book 1 of Leases, page 221, on March 11, 1905; for the term of twelve (12) years from the 18th day of October A. D. 1904, as in said lease provided, together with all our estate, right, title, interest, claim, property and demand of, in or to the lands, fish wheels, fishing appliances, lands, tenements, hereditaments and premises therein mentioned, which said William James now has by means of said indenture or otherwise; subject nevertheless, to all of the terms, payments, covenants and conditions in said indenture contained.

Do then and do hold this same, unto the said Columbia River Packers Association, from the 2nd day of September, A. D. 1905, for and during all the remainder yet to come of the said term of twelve (12) years mentioned in said indenture of lease; the said Columbia River Packers Association to become substitute to the obligations and liability of the said William James under said lease. And the said William James and Cora E. James covenant and agree to and with the said Columbia River Packers Association that the assigned premises now are free and clear of and from all former and other gifts, grants, bargains, sales, leases, encumbrances and incumbrances by them, or either of them, suffered, made or created.
