

MICHAEL LYNOTT TO J. F. SWEENEY.

Know all men by these presents that I Michael Lynott for and in consideration of the sum of \$200 dollars to me in hand paid by J.F. Sweeney have this day Bargained sold and Transferred and do by these presents bargain sell and transfer unto the said J.F. Sweeney one Sorrel Horse formerly owned by Wm. Greer also that part of a certain flume discribed more fully as follows towit:

Beginning at the Columbia river on the land now claimed by J. F. Sweeney and running thence in a North westerly direction untill it reaches the deviding line between the said J;F Sweeney and Michael Lynott land.

To have and ot hold unto the said J.F. Sweeney his heirs and assigns forever provided that a certain promissory Note given by the said ~~J.F. Sweeney~~ Micheal Lynott to the said J.F. Sweeney bearing date of April 19th 1894 and running five month from said date for \$150 dollars and bearing interest at seven per cent per annum remain unpaid at the expiration of said time But if said note is paid in full at maturity then this Bill of Sale shall be null and void otherwise to remain in full force. It is further understood by these presents that both the said J. F. Sweeney and Michael Lynott shall have the free

use of the said flume during the said term of the above  
mention ed note.
