Mr. Robie to Shaw.

Articles of Co-partnership made and entered into this 3rd day of October 1908 between Charles V. Mc Robie and William Shaw, both of Skamania, Washington.

The said parties have agreed and by these presents do agree to become co-partners in business together under and by the name of Mc Robie & Shaw in the business of manufacturing and selling cigars. And it is hereby agreed between the said parties that at all times during the continuance of their co-partnership they and each of them will give their attendance and to their and each of their best endeavors, and to the utmost of their skill and power to exert themselves for their joint interest and profit and that they will at all times during their co-partnership, bear, pay, and discharge equally between them all debts and other expenses that may be required for the support and management of the said business; that all profits that shall in any manner accrue from the said business, that all profits shall be divided between them share and share alike, and that all loss that shall happen to the said business by reason of bad debts, or otherwise, shall be born and paid between them equally; that the said

be kept accurate accounts of all the transactions and business of the said co-partnerships, in books accessible to each of the said parties. And it is hereby agreed that the interests of the said parties in said co-partnerships shall be as follows:

The said William Shum shall have a one half interest in all the profits of said business after all indebtedness of the co-partnerships have been paid.

The said Charles McRobie shall have a one half interest in all the profits of the said co-partnerships after all debts have been paid and he shall also have an interest equal to the full worth of all the stock (manufactured and unmanufactured) fixtures, moneys and credits of the said co-partnership, save and except so much as is required by one half interest in the undivided profits of the said co-partnerships.
