Know all men by these presents; that I Joseph Towsley of the County of Skamania and State of Washington, for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to me in hand paid by A.E. Beavans and Frank S. Clark of the same County and State, the receipt of which I hereby acknowledge have this day bargained sold and conveyed and do by these presents Bargain, sell and convey unto the aforesaid A. E. Bevans and Frank S. Clark a certain wood flume situated in Township 3 North of Range 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ East of the Willamette Meridian in Skamania County State of Washington, known as the Thompson Flume and built and formerly owned by the aforesaid Thompson having its starting point at the Columbia River at or near the mouth of Nelson Creek and running thence in a Northerly direction to where it takes its water from with all of its spurs and branches to have and sold to the aforesaid A. E. Bevans and Frank S. Clark, their heirs and assigns forever.
