Notice is hereby given that Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc., whose address is P.O. Box 1417, Sandy, Clartamas County, Oregon 97055, claims a lien upon twelve (12) truckloads and three (3) muletrain loads of Douglas Fir logs, being about 69,430 board feet in quantity, which were cut and manufactured in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, are rarked thus VP5, and are now lying in the Stevenson Co-Ply Home Valley log dump near Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in falling, bucking, yarding, loading and hauling said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner of said logs is Stevenson Co-Ply; and that Vanport Manufacturing, Inc. employed Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc. to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

(a) The logging agreement dated September 30, 1991, between Vanport Manufacturing, Inc. and Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc. allowed the claimant to deliver all utility logs logged by claimant from the Skin SSF Timber Sale, USDA Forest Service Contract No. 076891 to mills selected by

claimant; and

- (b) The mills receiving such logs were obligated to pay claimant for said utility logs and other grades of logs which may be delivered under this arrangement; and
- (c) Stevenson Co-Ply agreed to pay Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc. for all such utility logs and other grades of logs delivered from the Skin SSF Timber sale, USDA Forest Service Concract No. 076891, for such labor and assistance provided by claimant.

Said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with by Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc., who performed labor upor and assisted in falling, bucking, yarding, loading and hauling of the logs described in the attached Exhibit A during the period of November 20, 1991, through January 14, 1992; said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said timber and logs between November 20, 1991, and January 14, 1992; and the rendition of such services was closed on January 14, 1992, and sixty (60) days have not elapsed since that time.

The amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$24,102.10; no part thereof has been paid, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just offsets and credits the sum of \$24,102.10, in which amount Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc. claims a lien upon the logs described in the attached Exhibit A. Ray A. Schoppert Logging, Inc. also claims a lien upon all logs and lumber now owned by Stevenson Co-Ply of Skamania County, Washington, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said logs herein described.

The attached Exhibit A is hereby incorporated into and made a part of this claim of lien.

Stevenson Co-Ply became the owner of said logs upon the completion of deliveries of the (2) logs described above, and claimant became the owner of said logs after the timber was felled and remained so until each delivery was completed.
