In 1911 C. La Barre visited the site and reset the post from 2 of the bearing trees "one a stump the other green and a stump of third." (Book 5, Page 4)

A survey by Fred Laws (date unknown) shows that during a dependent resurvey the topographic calls matched the general land office notes and at the Northeast corner he established new accessories of. A 30" Fir North 44° West 472 links, a 40" Fir North 55° East 227 links a 40" Fir South 15° East 39 links and a 30" Fir South 54° West 147 links.

In 1980 Olson Engineering crews found a Washington Department of Game Concrete Monument Set. West 2641.13 feet from the North quarter corner of Section 4 and South 2570.11 feet from the East quarter corner of Section 32, Township 2 North, East 5 East. Olson records do not indicate the existence of any original or secondary accessories.


