MOTION TO INTERVENE

For reasons stated below, the United States Department of the Interior (Department) hereby respectfully moves the Commission, pursuant to Commission Rule of Practice and Procedure (Rule) 214, 18 C.F.R. § 385.214, for leave to intervene in these proceedings. PacificCorp Electric Operations has filed an application for a new license to operate the Condit Hydroelectric Project No. 2343. The proposed hydroelectric project is located on the White Salmon River in Skamania and Klickitat Counties, Washington. The White Salmon River flows into the Columbia River.

The Department represents national public interests which the proposed project would directly affect and which would not otherwise be represented before the Commission. Further, a number of bureaus within the Department have responsibilities related to resources that would be affected by activities to be undertaken pursuant to the proposed license. Of those bureaus, the following

1 have requested that the Department seek intervention: the Fish and
2 Wildlife Service and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

3 The interests and responsibilities of the Department, its
4 anticipated position as intervenor (as known at this time), and the
5 resulting grounds for its intervention are set forth below as a
6 basis for a Commission order granting the Department's motion to
7 intervene.

II. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

According to materials provided by the Applicant, the Condit hydroelectric project would consist of: (1) 125-foot-high concrete dam, approximately 471 feet long, at crest elevation 297.5 feet; (2) Northwestern Lake, a 665-acre-foot reservoir with a water surface of about 100 acres; (3) a 5,100-foot-long, 13.5-foot-diameter flow line connected to two 650-foot-long, 9-foot-diameter penstocks; and (4) a powerhouse containing two horizontal Francis-type turbines, having a combined rating of 9,000 horsepower. Each unit has a nameplate rating of 4.8 megawatts at 179 feet of head.

III. GROUNDS FOR INTERVENTION

Commission Rule 214 provides for intervention by a federal agency representing public interests which would be affected directly by the proposed project 18 C.F.R. § 385.214(b)(2)(i), (ii). In accordance with Rule 214, supra, a motion to intervene must state: (a) sufficient factual detail to establish that the movant's participation is in the public interest; and (b) the position taken by the movant and the basis in fact and in law for that position. The following statements provide compliance with these requirements.

A. PUBLIC INTEREST: INTERESTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of the Interior's interests in these proceedings are founded on a variety of statutory obligations and responsibilities and its trust responsibility to Indian tribes.

1 First, the potential impacts of the proposed project on
 2 fish and wildlife resources trigger a host of statutory
 3 responsibilities for the Department. The Fish and Wildlife
 4 Coordination Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 661-666c, authorizes the Secretary
 5 of the Interior to assist and cooperate with federal and private
 6 agencies to assure that fish and wildlife conservation measures
 7 receive "equal consideration" and are coordinated with other
 8 features of water projects, beginning with their initial planning
 9 stages. 16 U.S.C. § 661. Similarly, the Fish and Wildlife Act of
 10 1956, 16 U.S.C. §§ 742a-742j-2, as amended, requires the Secretary
 11 to determine the policies necessary and desirable to carry out fish
 12 and wildlife laws efficiently and in the national public interest.
 13 16 U.S.C. § 742f(a). With the Departmental staff, the Secretary is
 14 directed to develop and recommend measures to assure a maximum
 15 sustainable production of fish and to "take such steps as may be
 16 required for the development, advancement, management,
 17 conservation, and protection of fish and wildlife." 16 U.S.C. §
 18 742f(a)(1),(4). Acting through the Fish and Wildlife Service and
 19 other Departmental officials, the Secretary also has special
 20 responsibilities to protect various wildlife species under the
 Migratory Bird Treaty Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 703-12. Finally, under
 Section 10(j) of the Electric Consumers Protection Act of 1986, 16
 U.S.C. § 803(j), the Commission is required to include license
 conditions as recommended by the Fish and Wildlife Service to
 protect, mitigate, and enhance fish and wildlife resources
 adversely affected by hydroelectric power projects.

Further, the Secretary of the Interior through the Bureau of Indian Affairs has been delegated the authority to manage "all Indian affairs and ... all matters arising out of Indian relations." 25 U.S.C. § 2. Pursuant to that authority and the United States' trust responsibility to Indian tribes, the Secretary of the Interior is responsible for fulfilling the United States' fiduciary and statutory duties to protect the fishing rights of Indian tribes as reserved by and secured to the tribes in treaties with the United States. A number of Indian Tribes have treaty-protected fishing rights that may be affected by the proposed Condit Hydroelectric Project. First, the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakima Indian Nation, have treaty-protected fishing rights within the project area. Other Tribes whose treaty fishing rights may be affected by the Project include: Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation, and Nez Perce Tribe. The treaties of June 9, 1855, 12 Stat. 951; June 9, 1855, 12 Stat. 945; June 25, 1855, 12 Stat. 963; and June 11, 1855, 12 Stat. 957 secured to those Tribes, respectively, the right in common with the citizens of the territory to take fish in their respective usual and accustomed areas. See United States v. Washington, 384 F. Supp. 312 (W.D. Wash. 1974), and Sohappy v. Smith, 302 F. Supp. 899 (D. Or. 1969). This includes the right to take fish in the Columbia River and its tributaries.

The White Salmon River is within the usual and accustomed fishing area of the Yakima Tribe. The White Salmon River also

1 provides recruitment stock to the reach of the Columbia River that
2 is subject to the treaty-reserved fishing rights of the Yakima,
3 Umatilla, Warm Springs and Nez Perce Tribes. The fishery and the
4 associated habitat that supports the fishery are, therefore,
5 subject to the trust responsibility of the United States
6 Government.

7 The Yakima Tribe may also have treaty-protected hunting and
8 gathering rights and cultural resource interests that may require
9 consideration and protection in the licensing process.

10 The authorities cited above constitute Congressional
11 statements of the national public interest in protection of fish,
12 wildlife, cultural, and other resources. They also indicate
13 Congressional intent that the Department represent those interests
14 which would be affected directly by the activities of the Applicant
15 under any license issued for its proposed project. The Department
16 is seeking to protect the fish, wildlife, cultural, and other
17 important natural resources in the proposed Condit Project area.
18 No other party or intervencor has such authority to represent those
19 particular national public interests.

20 Finally, intervention by the Department would assist the
21 Commission in fulfilling efficiently its consultation,
22 coordination, environmental assessment, and related
23 responsibilities. Those responsibilities are set forth in such
24 statutes as the Endangered Species Act, 16 U.S.C. § 1536(a); the
25 Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act, 16 U.S.C. § 662(a); the
26 National Environmental Policy Act, 42 U.S.C. § 4332(2)(C); and the

1 Act of 1969, 42 U.S.C. Sections 4332(2).

2 B. ANTICIPATED POSITION OF THE DEPARTMENT

3 The Department has reviewed the proposed project in light
4 of its responsibilities and authorities pursuant to the above-cited
5 statutes and other relevant laws and regulations. Based on this
6 review, the position of the Department, as known at this time, is
7 described more fully below.

8 Pursuant to authority delegated to the Department, the
9 Department has reviewed the proposed action in relation to the fish
10 and wildlife resources in the Condit Hydroelectric Project area.
11 Based on this analysis, it has concluded that the project as
12 proposed could have serious adverse impacts on anadromous and
13 resident fish species, including chinook and coho salmon and
14 steelhead and resident rainbow trout; on wildlife species; on the
15 exercise of Indian treaty rights; and on Indian cultural resources.

16 The White Salmon River is tributary to the Columbia River.
17 The White Salmon River and its watershed provide high quality
18 habitat for fish and wildlife resources. Further, it is the Fish
19 and Wildlife Service's goal to restore anadromous fish runs to
20 their former habitat and their former abundance above Condit Dam,
21 to correct existing physical and operational problems affecting
22 fish and wildlife resources, to restore and rehabilitate degraded
23 spawning and rearing habitat downstream from Condit Dam, and to
24 mitigate the loss of wildlife habitat values resulting from the
25 development and operation of project facilities. The Service's
26 goals are consistent with the Northwest Power Planning Council's

1 Columbia River Fish and Wildlife program which calls for dam
2 passage at Condit Dam.

3 The Department has reviewed the license application and is
4 concerned about the many project-related impacts to anadromous and
5 resident fish species and wildlife species that have not been
6 adequately addressed by the Applicant. During the course of this
7 proceeding, the Department would seek to assure that project
8 impacts on fish and wildlife resources were identified. The
9 Department would recommend measures which would avoid adverse
10 effects upon fish and wildlife resources and which would mitigate
11 for unavoidable adverse effects.

12 In addition, the United States has trust responsibilities for
13 the reserved property interests of the Yakima and other Indian
14 Tribes, as described above. The Department is concerned about the
15 many project-related impacts on fish, wildlife, plant, and cultural
16 resources that have not been considered during the term of the past
17 license, a situation that must be resolved during the Condit
18 hydroelectric project relicensing proceeding. During the course of
19 the proceeding, the Department would seek to assure that Indian
20 cultural resources and Indian trust rights and resources, including
21 those associated with treaty-protected fishing, hunting, and
22 gathering rights, are identified, considered, and protected.

23 VI. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

24 Accordingly, for the reasons stated above, the Department of
25 the Interior moves the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to
26 issue an order granting the Department's motion to intervene in
