All of Section 4, T. 1 N., R. 6 E.W.M., Skamania County, Washington, lying south of the south right-of-way line of State Highway 14, together with the second class shorelands abutting said section. EXCEPTING THEREFROM the following four tracts:

Beginning at the northeast corner of said Section 4; thence westerly along the north line of said Section 4, a distance of 1500 feet; thence southerly parallel with the east line of said Section 4, a distance of 1000 feet; thence easterly a distance of 1500 feet to a point on the east line of said Section 4, which is 1000 feet south of the northeast corner thereof; thence north along said east line 1000 feet to the point of beginning.

That portion of the following tract lying southerly of the south right-of-way line of the Burlington Northern Railroad: Commencing at a point on the north line of said Section 4, 1500 feet west of the northeast corner of said Section and running thence south 522.45 feet; thence south 73°33'00" west 250.00 feet; thence north 84°18'00" west 400.00 feet; thence north 66°00'00" west 345.00 feet, more or less, to the westerly bank of a creek commonly known as Indian Mary Creek; thence southerly along said westerly bank to the mean high water line of Franz Lake; thence westerly along said mean high water line to a point which is 1700 feet west of the east line of the parcel herein described; thence north 300 feet, more or less, to the north line of said Section 4; thence east along said north line 1700 feet to the point of beginning.

Those two tracts located in Section 4, T. 1 N., R. 6 E.W.M., as conveyed in Book 35, page 272 by William R. Price and Carrie M. Price, husband and wife, to Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway Company, recorded June 20, 1922.

PROVISIONS

"The instantaneous amount of water granted under this water right is a maximum limit that shall not be exceeded. Water availability under this authorization is subject to natural fluctuations and may not provide a continual year-round supply."

At such time that the Department of Ecology determines the regulation and management of the subject waters is necessary and in the public interest, an approved measuring device shall be installed and maintained in accordance with RCW 90.03.360 and WAC 508-64-020 through -040.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380, 90.03.390, and 90.44.020.

This certificate of water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for nonuse of water as provided in RCW 90.14.180.
