A 12" D.Fir bears N55°W 36.3" scribed "CN NE 1/64 S27 BT"

Placed "BF" tags and "Land Survey Monument" signs on all BT's. Painted 5" red band and faces on all Bt's.

Corner falls on flat ground, approximately 75' NE of water tank on private property. Forest Service property lines leading west and east are brushed, blazed, and posted w/USFS carsonite posts. Bearings are by compass w/ 21° East declination. Fistances are to nail in side center of bearing tree.


