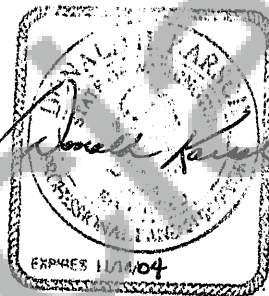

Corner History:

This corner was originally established by Larry D. Bishop, PLS #16337 in May of 1982, and monumented with a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 2 1/2" cap. He also marked 2 bearing trees:

7" D-Fir S74°W, 18.9 ft. scribed "NE 1/16 S16" upper blaze and a lower blaze scribed "BT"
 16" D-Fir S4°W, 20.4 ft. scribed "NE 1/16 S16" upper blaze and a lower blaze scribed "BT"

On July 16, 2003 I found the corner monument, set 4" above ground, in good condition.

Found Bishop BT's:

A 7" now 8" D.Fir found fallen. Root wad at record S74°W, 18.9 ft. with BT tag and visible overgrown faceblaze.
 A 16" now 19" D. Fir found live with visible overgrown face blaze bears S4°W, 20.4 ft.

New BT's Established:

A 23" D.Fir bearing S85°E, 43.7' was scribed "NE 1/16 S16 BT"

Placed "BT" tags and "Land Survey Monument" signs on all BT's. Painted 6" red band and faces on all Bt's. Set location tag on 19" D. Fir bearing N50°W 2.8'

Corner sits on flat ground in stand of 2nd growth Douglas Fir trees. Forest service property lies south and west of corner. Property lines leading north and east from corner are brushed, blazed, and posted w/USFS carsonite posts. Bearings are by compass w/ 18° East declination. Distances are to nail in side center of bearing tree.

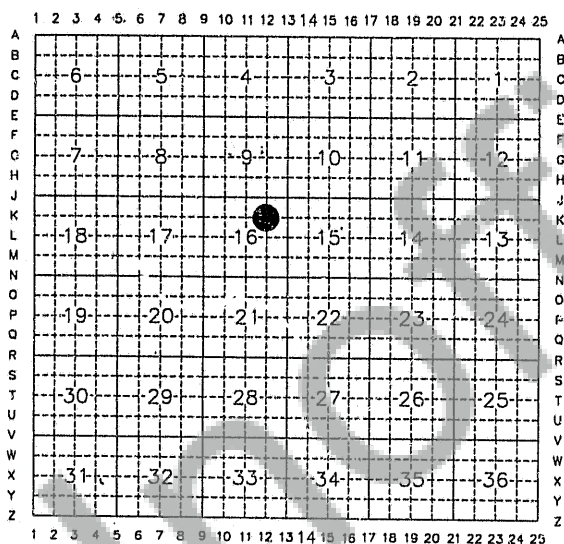

For corners that are between lines, the corner code is both line segments; i.e., a corner in the SE1/4 of the SE1/4 of section 18 is designated MN 4-5.
