

J. P. Gillette to Bank of Stevenson

Know All Men By these Presents that I, J. P. Gillette am now and do hereby acknowledge myself to be indebted to the Bank of Stevenson in the sum of Two thousand Dollars (\$2000) lawful money of the United States, for all of which I have received full value and consideration, and that said debt is now fully due and payable.

Now, Therefore for the purpose of settling said debt and the whole thereof with interest, and for and in consideration thereof, I hereby sell, transfer and deliver into the possession of the Bank of Stevenson and its assigns, all that certain stock of drugs, druggist's sundries, furniture, fixtures and supplies and cash and every article of personal property in and about and used in connection with that certain drug store known and described as Gillette's Pharmacy in the north-west corner of the Dr. Army Hospital Building in Stevenson, Shannqua County, State of Washington, all as shown by the inventory attached hereto and made a part hereof. It is hereby understood that said Bank of Stevenson is to take immediate possession of said property, fully inventory and account for the same, carry on said business in the usual manner and place and through its regular agent, or agents, and fully and accurately account to me or my legal representatives at stated times, not less than once in each week, of all the transactions of said business, and to retain (after paying all the expenses of operating and carrying on said business) the net proceeds thereof and apply the same upon the above named indebtedness, until the same shall have been fully paid. After the payment of said indebtedness shall have been made as above set out, then said property and business is to be turned back to me, or my legal representative, the intention being that all said property and business over and above the amount of said indebtedness is considered as overplus on mortgage, and to be paid over to me as mortgagor.

The above and foregoing being community property we individually and as husband and wife join in the execution hereof.
