

Douglass to Shelley

Know All Men by these presents: That J. A. C. Douglass, of Stevenson, Washington, and Emma Douglass, his wife of the same place, parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred, sixty and $\frac{62}{100}$ Dollars to them in hand paid by R. D. Shelley, the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns the following personal property, to wit:

Four horses, named Dan, Sam, Mack and Prince

Two sets of harness

Two saddles

One buggy

Two hacks

Two wagons

Two wheel scrapers, two clips, two plows, Office furniture, stove and all other paraphernalia now in or around and used in connection with the Livery Business which had heretofore been conducted by said first party on lots 23, 24, 25, and 26 of Block 4 of the Town of Stevenson, and any and everything not otherwise herein specified, used in connection with said business, saving and excepting, however such articles as may belong to individuals, and which have been agreed to and understood by and between the parties hereto.

To have and to hold the same unto the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators, and assigns forever. And I do for myself, my heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant and agree to and with the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, to warrant and defend the sale of the said property, goods and chattels hereby made unto the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, all and every person and persons, whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same, subject, however to a certain chattel mortgage on the property described herein and held by the Bank of Stevenson in the sum of \$750.00 together with all interest and charges thereon, and which mortgage the said second party hereby agrees to assume. And I further covenant and agree to and with the

party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, that we will not engage in the livery or dray business in the Town of Stevenson at any time in the future while said second party is so engaged and that we will not in any way interfere with him in making a success of said business which we have by these presents solicited.
