Know All Men By These Presents,
That I, Caspar Gropper, for and in Considera-
tion of the sum of Three Hundred twenty-five
(\$325.00) Dollars to me paid by the firm of
Maier & Schanno of The Dalles, Oregon, have
bargained, sold and transferred and do By These
Presents bargain, sell and transfer unto
the said Maier & Schanno all of the
following described personal property, to-wit:
One Hundred (100) Cords of four foot fir Cord
wood now being on the premises of Caspar
Gropper about one mile back, in a Northwesterly
direction of Steunass, Washington.

To Have and To Hold the said personal
property unto the said Maier & Schanno, their
heirs and assigns forever.

It is understood that the sum of \$60.00 of
the consideration above mentioned, and
also one black gelding - - - - - Branded MB
on shoulder valued at \$100.00, making a total
of \$160.00 of the consideration above mentioned
has heretofore been advanced to me by the
said firm of Maier & Schanno and that the
balance of \$165.00 of said consideration shall
be due and payable upon the delivery of all
of said Cord wood on the beach of the
Columbia River at Steunass, Washington, in
a convenient place to be loaded on the scow,
said delivery to be made in the summer
and fall of 1915 following high water in the
Columbia River.
