Know All Men By These Presents:
That J. J. M^c Nutt, for and in consideration
of the sum of One Hundred thirteen and ⁵⁷/₁₀₀
Dollars (\$113.57) to me paid by the firm of
Maier & Schanno of The Dalles, Oregon, have
agreed, sold and transferred and do By
These Presents, bargain, sell and transfer unto
the said Maier & Schanno all of the following
described personal property, to-wit:

Thirty-eight (38) cords of four foot five
cord wood now lying on the premises of
A. J. Haynes about three miles back in a
westerly direction, of Underwood, Washington.

To Have and To Hold the said Personal
Property unto the said Maier & Schanno, their
heirs and assigns forever.

It is understood that the sum of \$55.10
of the consideration above mentioned has
thereof been advanced to me by the said
firm of Maier & Schanno and that the
balance of \$58.40 of said consideration
shall be due and payable upon the delivery
of all of the said cord wood on the bank
of the Columbia River at Underwood, Washington,
in a convenient place to be loaded on the
screw, said delivery to be made in the
Summer and Fall of 1915 following the
high-water in the Columbia River.

It is further understood that the
said balance of \$58.40 shall, when due, be
applied on account, if there be any, against
me at the store of Maier & Schanno.
