This Cow was traded for by my wife with Geo. De Forest and in which I had no further interest than as agent for my said wife, all of said property traded to said Geo. De Forest having belonged to her.

To Have And To Hold the same unto the said party of the second part her executors, administrators and assigns forever. And I do for my heirs, executors and administrators Covenant and agree to and with said party of the second part her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns to warrant and defend the sale of said property, goods and chattels hereby sold unto the said party of the second part her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against all and every person and persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
