two years old, named Bill, distinguishing
mark, white face and white hind foot, also
One yearling Colt, iron gray, distinguishing
mark, two white hind legs and white face.

To Have and To Hold the same unto
the said party of the second part his
executor, Administrator and assigns forever.
And I do for my heirs, executor and
administrator covenant and agree to and
with said party of the second part his
executor, administrator and assigns to warrant
and defend the sale of said property, goods
and chattels unto the said L. F. Inman, party
of the second part, hereby sold unto the
said party of the second part, his heirs,
executor, administrator and assigns, against
all and every person and persons whomsoever
lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
