 sold, and by these presents do grant and  
 Convey unto the said party of the second  
 part his executors, Administrators and  
 assigns, One Bay Mare, six years old, Weighs  
 about 1300 lbs, named Baby, distinguishing  
 mark, star in forehead. One year gray Colt,  
 two years old, named Bill, distinguishing  
 mark, white face and white hind foot, also  
 One yearling Colt, iron gray, distinguishing  
 mark, two white hind legs and white face.

To Have and To Hold the same unto  
 the said party of the second part his  
 executors, Administrators and assigns forever.  
 And I do for my heirs, executors and  
 administrators Covenant and agree to and  
 with said party of the second part his  
 executors, Administrators and assigns to warrant  
 and defend the same of said property, Goods  
 and Chattels unto the said L. F. Duran, party  
 of the second part, hereby sold unto the  
 said party of the second part, his heirs,  
 executors, Administrators and assigns, against  
 all and every person and persons whomsoever  
 lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
