Whitten To Meyer Kelley Co.

Know All Men By These Presents, That We
 N. B. Whitten and Jessie Whitten, husband
 and wife, parties of the first part and
 Meyer & Kelley Company party of the second part,
 Witnesseth;

That "Whereas" the said parties of the
 first part are the owners of a certain Buick
 Automobiles, Model C.55, 1915, Engine No. 176, Horse
 Power 34, being a five passenger car of a
 blue color and still owe on the purchase
 price thereof the sum of \$75.00 and
 interest in accordance with the terms of a
 certain promissory note dated July 27th
 1916, payable to the United States National
 Bank of Vancouver, Washington, on or before
 March 27th 1917, and

Whereas, the said parties of the second
 part have given security on the said note
 above mentioned and the said first parties

of the desirability of securing the said second parties against loss by reason of the failure of said first parties to pay the above mentioned Note according to the terms and conditions thereof:

This Bill of Sale is made on the condition that the said parties of the first part shall have the possession and the use of said automobile so long as and during all the time they shall have kept up the payments on the note heretofore mentioned and do not allow any of the payments to become delinquent.

It is expressly understood and agreed that said parties of the first part shall at all times take the best possible care and attention of said car, and that in case a fault is made in the payment^{or payments} of said note according to the tenor thereof and

the said parties of the second part shall have to pay the same, then and in that event the said parties of the second part may take immediate possession of said automobile and at their option pay the difference between the value of the car at the time it is so taken over by them and the amount they may have to pay on said note, to said ~~first~~ parties as the first part.
