(being 12 herses in all); 2 cows, named Sookie and Bossie; calso all the other personal property now being in and around the livery barn at Underwood, Wash and belonging to above party of the first part, the intention is to lease all personal property now in possession of said party of the first part and being connected with the livery business of the Livery Barn known as Horses Home stables at Underwood, Wash. Provided however that this lease shall be null and word if title to above property is conveyed to parties of second part herein by warranty deed and bill of sale properly signed by Cornelia Stuart and L.J. Stuart her husband, otherwise to be in full force and virtue until cancelled by both parties hereto. Provided further that all payments made under this lease shall be credited on the first payment made by said parties of the second part to said party of the first part in case that above mentioned conveyance by warranty deed and bill of sale is properly made, and the said parties of the second part doth hereby promise and agree to pay said party of the first part therefore the rent following to-wit:

Forty dollars per month payable on 23rd day of each wouth, and to return said premises at the expiration of said time in as good order and condition as they are now in, reasonable wear and tear fir and unavoidable casualties excepted.
