Know all men by these presents: That the Bank of Stevenson, a Washington corporation, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar and other considerations to it in hand paid by John F. Sweeney, party of the second part, at or before the delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby these presents grant, and convey unto said party of the second part and his assigns, the following described property to-wit: Five horses as follows: One black horse named Nick, one year of bay horse named Pat and Bill, one year of bay horse named Denis and Jake, the said horses being the same that were conveyed to the Bank of Stevenson by John F. Sweeney and Elizabeth Sweeney, his wife, by bill of sale dated September 17th 1907, which bill of sale is recorded in Book 2 of Bills of Sale in the office of the County Clerk of St. Mary's County, Washington. To have and to hold the same unto the said party of the second part and to his executor and assigns forever. And the said party of the first part does covenant and agree to warrant and defend the said sale of said property as against all and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.

Sweeney and William Sweeney, of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred fifty seven and 32/100 Dollars lawful money of the United States, to them in hand paid, at or before the signing and delivery of these presents to Bank of Stevenson, a Washington corporation, of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant and convey unto said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the following described personal property, to-wit: Four horses as follows, one black horse, named Nick, in horse has one white foot, weight about 1700#; one year of bay horse, named Pat and Bill, weight about 2100#, star on forehead of Bill, horse Pat a solid bay; one sorrel horse named Corral, weight about 1150#, mottled by white head feet; All of said horses being in Stevenson, Washington in possession of the parties of the first part. This bill of sale is given to secure the payment of a promissory note, made by John F. Sweeney, William F. Sweeney and George W. Sweeney for \$457.32 with interest thereon from date thereof.
