Sweeney and William Sweeney, of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred fifty seven and 32/100 Dollars lawful money of the United States, to them in hand paid, at or before the signing and delivery of these presents to Bank of Stevenson, a Washington corporation, of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant and convey unto said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the following described personal property, to-wit: Four horses as follows, one black horse, named Nick, said horse has one white foot, weight about 1700#; one year of bay horse, named Pat and Bill, weight about 2100#, star on forehead of Bill, horse Pat a solid bay; one sorrel horse named Corral, weight about 1150#, marked by white hind feet; All of said horses being in Stevenson, Washington in possession of the parties of the first part.
