## Bank of Stevenson to N. P. Nelson &amp; wife

Know all men by these Presents: That whereas N. P. Nelson and Selma Nelson, his wife, did on the 7th day of June 1910 sell, transfer and assign unto the Bank of Stevenson, of Stevenson, Wash., a certain bill of sale of furniture, fixtures and stock of goods being in the Stevenson Hotel Building situate on lots 15 and 16 in Block one of Riverview Addition to the Town of Stevenson, which bill of sale bears date the 7th day of June 1910, executed by C.
