One Spring Tooth Harrow, One Spike Tooth Harrow, One Disk Harrow, One Steam Harrow, Three Old Plows, One Humble Harrow, One Faultless Heavy Puller and all equipment of hooks, cable plows etc, One Waggon, One Buggy, Two horses, called Frank and Stolly, One set of harness, One Cow, named Jess, One calf, All small tools and articles of equipment now in use or found upon the North east quarter (1/4) of the Southeast quarter of Section 16 Township Three North Range Ten East of Willminton Meridian.

To have and to hold the same to the said party of second part her executor administrators and assigns forever. And he do for his heirs executors and assigns covenant and agree to and with the said party of second part her heirs and assigns to warrant and defend the title of said property, goods and chattels against all and every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
