Know all Men by these Presents: That, William F. Thompson of Stevenson, the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said party of the second part, the following, described personal property now located at Stevenson in the building E. Cor. Russell Ave and 1st St. in the County of Kamania and State of Washington, to wit:

All Barber supplies, including three Barber chairs and Back Bar; also all merchandise, including, Cigars, Tobacco and candy and all fixtures, including show cases and all other personal effects thereunto belonging to said mercantile establishment, also all Household Goods, including furniture chairs, carpets, beds and all other furniture of whatever kind.

To Have and to Hold the same to the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, and said party of the first part for his heirs, executors, administrators, covenant, and agrees to and with the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, that said party of the first part is the owner of the said property, goods, and chattels and has good right and full authority to sell the same, and that he will warrant and defend the sale hereby made unto the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, against all and every person or persons, whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.

W. F. Slaughter et al. to John Patterson

Know all men by these presents that W. F. Slaughter, J. D. Welch and W. A. Welch the parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two thousand Dollars Gold Coin of the United States of America, to us in hand paid by John Patterson the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant bargain, sell, and convey unto the said party of the second part his executors, administrators and assigns, all of the following described personal property, to wit:

About 300,000 feet of logs rafted at Carson in Skamania County, Washington.

This instrument is given as security for the payment of Two Thousand Dollars advanced by party of the second part evidenced by a note of even date bearing 8% interest. It is understood by the parties hereto that when the logs are sold party of the second part is to receive the amount of money advanced with the interest thereon and after said amount of Two Thousand Dollars and interest has been paid the remainder of the proceeds of said sale for the above mentioned logs up to seven Dollars per thousand feet shall be paid to parties of the first part. All amounts received in excess of seven Dollars per thousand feet
