States District Engineer, Bonneville District, Bonneville, Oregon an offer of Settlement,

WHEREAS, It appears to the Council that the sum of \$550.00 is the amount it will be damaged by the reason of the said over-flow upon said property:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Stevenson offer to settle and compromise the said damage claim with the United States of America for the sum of \$550.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution or such other written offer as may be satisfactory to the said District Engineer be submitted to the United States District Engineer, Bonneville District, Bonneville, Oregon and that upon acceptance of said offer, if the same be accepted, the Mayor of the Town of Stevenson be and he hereby is authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the United States of America a deed or other instrument in writing, conveying to the United States of America, all the said real property, or a flowage easement thereover as may be by said engineer required and that the said instrument be duly attested by the Clerk of the Town of Stevenson, as required by law.
