THIS INDENTURE, Made this 9th day of August, 1938 between M. T. Borden Sheriff of the County of Skamania, State of Washington, party of the first part, and F. J. McGowan & Sons of the County of Skamania, State of Washington part of the second part, witnesseth;

THAT, WHEREAS, By virtue of a general execution issued out of and under the seal of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, in and for said County, on the 1st day of July, 1937, upon a judgment rendered in said Court in cause No. 2384-C on the 28th day of June 1937, in favor of P.J.
