

NOW AT THIS TIME, This cause coming on to be further heard and upon consideration thereof, and the Court being duly advised; and it appearing to the Court that on the 20th day of March, 1939, this Court entered a Judgment on Stipulation as to defendant Helen E. Thun, an unmarried woman, wherein the Court ordered and adjudged that on payment into the registry of this Court of the sum of ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE and 00/100 Dollars (\$125.00) for the benefit of defendant Helen E. Thun, an unmarried woman, which sum is exclusive of and shall not bear interest, a judgment and decree of this Court shall be entered, appropriating and condemning for the uses and purposes of the petitioner herein, United States of America, a perpetual flowage easement over the hereinafter described lands, together with the further right to go upon said lands from time to time as the occasion may require, for the purpose of removing therefrom the timber and other natural growth and any accumulations of brush, trash or driftwood; and it now appearing to the Court that the amount of money above set forth has been paid into the registry of
