Flowage easement. (Office Chief of Engineers. Jun 30, 1939 6500 (Bonneville Dam)

This Indenture, made this 11th day of April, 1939, by Northwestern Electric Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Washington, hereinafter called the Grantor, to the United States of America, hereinafter called the Covernment, Witnesseth:

That Whereas, the Government is constructing a dam across the Columbia River between the States of Oregon and Washington at Bonneville, Oregon, and upon the completion of said dam will operate and maintain a spillway, power house and ship lock; and

Whereas, under operating conditions, all lands abutting on either bank of said river from Bonneville to the Celilo Canal which are below the elevation of the backwater curve which begins at the dam at 72.0 feet above mean sea level (as determined by reference to the U.S.C. & C.S. bench mark, B. 24, situate about one mile east along the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company&s track from Warrendale, Multnomah County, Oregon, in the north end of a concrete culvert, at elevation 72.533 feet) will be permanently flooded; and

Whereas, the Government in operating said structures, will increase periodically the depth and duration of the overflow on a portion of said lands, hereinafter described, lying above election 72.0 feet; and
