particular kinds, classes or items of property shall not be deemed to exclude from the operation of this Indenture any kind, class or item not so referred to or enumerated:

A. BRIDGE PROPERTIES.

The cantilever steel toll bridge (known as the "Bridge of the Gods") over and across the Columbia River between the States of Oregon and Washington located within two miles westerly of Cascade Locks, County of Hood River, State of Oregon, together with all iron and stone abutments, piers, supports, approaches and appurtenances thereto belonging, including the toll house located on said bridge.

B. RIGHTS, LICENSES, FRANCHISES, EASEMENTS AND LEASES.

1. That Certain Right to construct, maintain and operate a bridge and its approaches thereto across the Columbia River at a point suitable to the interests of navigation at or near a point within two (2) miles westerly from Cascade Locks in the County of Hood River, State of Oregon, and That Certain License to construct, maintain and operate an approach to the aforementioned bridge over property belonging to the Government of the United States, said approach being constructed as near as practicable upon the following locations, to-wit:

Across an area two hundred (200) feet in width, the center line of which originates and bears as follows: Being at a point on the section line between Sections 12 and 13 in Township 2 North, Range 7 East, Willamette Meridian, in Hood River County, Oregon, 4,494 feet west of the southeast corner of said Section 12, Township 2 North, Range 7 East, thence extending in a straight line bearing north 76° 44' west to an intersection with the north shore of the Columbia River in the State of Washington,

all as authorized and granted by an Act of Congress approved February 3, 1920, being Public Law No. 130 (Chapter 60) of the Public Laws of the Sixty-sixth Congress of the United States, Second Session; as extended by an Act of Congress approved February 15, 1921, being Public Law No. 311 (Chapter 53) of the Public Laws of the Sixty-sixth Congress of the United States, Third Session, and an Act of
