- 1, 1968 payable to A. C. Allyn and Company, Incorporated, or on its order, in the aggregate principal amount of \$210,000.
- (n) "Bridge"—the bridge across the Columbia River described in the granting clauses hereof.
- (o) "Consulting Engineers"—Tudor Engineering Company of San Francisco, California, or any firm or organization of bridge engineers of nation-wide reputation for skill and experience in the construction and operation of toll bridges as may from time to time be approved by an instrument or instruments in writing filed with the Trustee signed by holders of not less than sixty per cent (60%) in principal amount of the bonds at the time outstanding hereunder, but until receipt by the Trustee of such written instrument or instruments signed by holders of the requisite percentage of outstanding bonds approving other consulting engineers Tudor Engineering Company shall act as consulting engineers for the purposes of this Indenture.

Section 1.02. For all purposes of this Indenture:

- (a) Words of the masculine gender shall be deemed and construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders;
- (b) The words "bond", "owner", "holder", and "person" shall include the plural as well as the singular number unless the context shall otherwise indicate;
- (c) The term "bondholders" means and contemplates, unless the context otherwise indicates, the holders of the bonds at the time issued and outstanding hereunder; and
- (d) Each of the words "person" and "corporation" shall include the other, unless the context shall otherwise indicate.

Section 1.03. Whenever in this Indenture it is provided that any facts or opinions be evidenced to the Trustee by means of a certificate, statement, opinion, or other document, it shall constitute compliance herewith if the various facts and/or opinions intended so to be evidenced to the Trustee be included in different certificates, statements, opinions, or other documents signed by the same person or different persons of the same qualifications.
